Practicums

Students are required to spend a total of 7 weeks in a Waldorf classroom (1 week in 1st year, 3 weeks in 2nd year and 3 weeks in 3rd year) on Observation/Practicum placements. Students must gain an additional 4 weeks of classroom experience in Waldorf schools during the 3 years of the program.

Graduation and Certification Policy

BACWTT awards a certificate to students who have completed all three years with no incompletes on their transcripts, and who have paid their tuition and loan balance in full. Students who finish the 3-year program, but have incompletes on their transcripts will have a grace period of 1 year to complete missing work, assignments, and retake courses free of charge.

After this time period, students will be required to pay for each course on a per credit basis of \$200 per credit, plus a \$75 administrative fee per transcript update. For example: Kingdom of Childhood - 4 weekends/18.0 hour course/2.0 credits

Retake fee = \$400 plus \$75 administration fee = \$475

Applications are accepted year-round. Admission is open to all adults. Classes are capped as soon as they meet the maximum number of students. Applications received after the class is filled will go onto a waitlist, and applicants will only be admitted if space becomes available. Students under 21 years old will generally not be admitted, but the Program Director may make exceptions in individual cases.
