- We have an international reputation for excellence in Waldorf teacher training
- We have an experienced, stable faculty

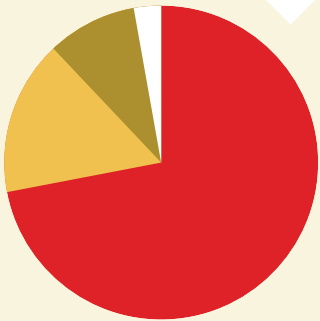

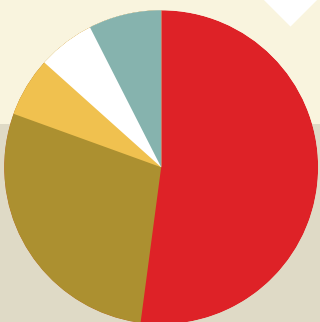

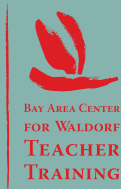
