Position responsibilities include:

Plan and maintain an after school program which provides balance and support for children after their Preschool day ends, including an age appropriate rest time, snacks and activities.

Work with Preschool Lead and Assistant to plan and implement a smooth transition of children and staff.

Maintain general order and an aesthetically beautiful Preschool environment both indoors and out

Oversee children in the classroom and on the play yard.

Guide children with self-care (toileting, handwashing, dressing and social behavior).

Provide first aid as necessary.

Practice confidentiality toward matters involving parents and children.

Ensure that the classroom is clean and ready for use the following day.

Observe and communicate student behaviors to appropriate colleagues.
