Previous Experience with Anthroposophy and Waldorf Education

Graduation and Certification Policy

BACWTT awards a HTA certificate to students who have completed all three years with no incompletes on their transcripts, and who have paid their tuition and loan balance in full. Students who finish the 3-year program, but have incompletes on their transcripts will have a grace period of 1 year to complete missing work, assignments, and retake courses free of charge. After this time period, students will be required to pay for each course on a per credit basis of \$200 per credit, plus a \$75 administrative fee per transcript update.
