- A desire to work with students beyond academics to help them develop the capacities to know themselves and their place in the world.
- Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree from an accredited four-year college or university.

General Statement of Duties:

- Teaching assigned classes and supporting other teachers to facilitate the whole school schedule. If qualified, may also teach other subjects.
- Supporting extracurricular activities: Examples include: advising students, playground and meal supervision, chaperoning field trips, or mentoring various clubs.
- Administrative responsibilities include school committee work, all school workshops, student reports, parent work, and duties like lunch coverage, opening/closing the school for the day, or subbing for an absent peer.
